11 SCORING

11.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.

11.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

11.3 (a) When fewer than four (4) races have been completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When five (5) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

12 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats must register with the OA during registration hours and shall be assigned a flag which is required to be flown at all times while in the racing area.

13 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the boat park.

14 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Keelboat haul out restrictions if applicable will be defined in the SI's.

15 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

16 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows <list prizes>

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
