

2012 Host Club Application Form

Criteria for successful applicants include, but are not limited to:

- · Good standing member of BC Sailing
- No existing Optimist training programs for youth
- Safe location for conducting sailing classes (both on the water and on shore)
- Offer amenities such as drinking water (please provide water if this does not exist)
- Offer facilities for classroom instruction and washrooms.
- Offer billeting to coaches
- Community support and/or support from club directors and members
- Dedicated volunteer(s) willing to market and administrate program
- Able to provide 1 mature volunteer (15 yrs or older), or hire 1 additional trained coach to assist BC Sailing's coaches
- If a volunteer without prior coaching experience, it is *highly recommended* he/she attend an Optimist coach development clinic in Vancouver. Each community may send one volunteer to receive this training *FREE*. Schedule to be announced on BC Sailing website in January.
- Have plans and a means to offer youth sailing programs without the help of the mobile sailing school in subsequent years, or in the near future (2 – 3 years)

Application process:

- 1. Please visit the MOSS website moss.bcsailing.bc.ca. In particular read the "Host Club" section for important information regarding program goals and responsibilities
- 2. Complete the application form and questionnaire below and submit to Daniel Cowan, MOSS Coordinator for BC Sailing Assoc., by **December 23, 2011**. Applications received after this date will be considered on a first-come, first-serve basis.

- 3. BC Sailing will respond to all applications as soon as possible. Successful applicants will receive a start-up package with resources to help with setting up the program at your club
- 4. Begin registering students
- 5. A "healthy" number of students must be registered at least four weeks prior to course start date (ideally, at least 16 students). If registration is not looking promising, BC Sailing may cancel the class and refund any students who have already registered. Note this is a last alternative and we'll do everything we can to avoid it, however, we will not risk running the course at a loss.
