

Technical packages are a critical part of the Ontario Games. They assist the organizing committees by detailing tournament formats and scoring procedures, help with all aspects of Games planning including transportation budget, meals, accommodations, etc. by identifying the number of participants permitted (including gender etc.).

Every participating Games PSO coach and/or manager has an obligation to read and understand every aspect of the Technical Package. Failure to do so could cost an athlete his or her eligibility for the Games or could affect final standings or the delivery of the competition. If someone does not understand an aspect of the Technical Package, he or she is to seek clarification from the Provincial Sport Organization or the Sport Alliance of Ontario.

If an individual wishes to initiate change to a Sport Technical Package, the request should be directed to the Provincial Sport Organization. Sport Technical Packages are reviewed and negotiated with the Sport Alliance of Ontario and the hosting Games Organizing Committee approximately 12 - 14 months from the games. Change will not be accepted after the Technical Package has been approved for the games without consent of all three parties.

Facility Requirements – attach any available diagrams: 2 North American (85' x 200') or Olympic (100' x 200') ice surfaces in one complex required – seating also required.

Specialized markings and requirements: none

Number of required practice/warm up areas: <u>1 – large enough room to accommodate 16 synchronized skaters</u>

Other: Removal of glass required – 2 on either side of the entry gate as well as in front of judges stand if required. No glass or post barrier for the length of the judges' stand. May also have to remove glass for videographer. To be determind following site visit

NOTE: Training Days will not be provided by the GOC. If Training Days are required, all associated costs are the responsibility of the PSO.

Facility standards: Please outline your minimum requirements below.

| Field of Play Facilities (dimension of gym, height of a ski hill) | Two standard hockey size rinks (85' x 200') or Olympic size (100' x 200') Off ice warm-up area for skaters to stretch and practice jumps and lifts – an area on concourse or gymnasium would work. Generally dressing rooms are not large enough. |

| Change Facilities (size, number) | 6 standard dressing rooms |
| Storage Requirements | One heated and locked room to store overnight the computers and other equipment required by the officials. This could be included in the room for the data specialists (below) if their room is large enough. |
| Other | Heated room near rink side with tables and chairs (approx. 20-24) for judges' meetings pre and post competition. The Technical Representative will manage events from here. A second heated room (which can be locked) and with a power supply, close to the rink side with a photocopier with sorter for the data specialist to prepare the information for the judges and produce results. Table and chairs also required – 3 large tables and 6 chairs required. This room as well as photocopier with sorter is required all day on Thursday for set up as well as during the competition. |
