ONTARIO GAMES SPORT TECHNICAL PACKAGE

Technical packages are a critical part of the Ontario Games. They guide the selection of athletes by prescribing the age and eligibility requirements, assist the organizing committees by detailing tournament formats and scoring procedures, help with all aspects of Games planning including transportation budget, meals, accommodations, etc. by describing the number of participants permitted.

Every participating PSO Games coach and/or manager has an obligation to read and understand every aspect of the Technical Package. Failure to do so could cost an athlete his or her eligibility for the Games or could affect final standings or the conduct of the competition. If someone does not understand an aspect of a Technical Package, he or she is to seek clarification from the Provincial Sport Organization or the Sport Alliance of Ontario.

If an individual wishes to initiate change to a Sport Technical Package, the request should be directed to the Provincial Sport Association. Sport Technical Packages are reviewed and negotiated with the Sport Alliance of Ontario and the hosting Games Organizing Committee approximately 12 - 14 months from the games. Change will not be accepted after the Technical Package has been approved for the games without consent of all three parties.

<p>Field of Play Facilities (dimension of gym, height of a ski hill)</p>	<p>Parallel GS – For parallel Giant Slalom (PGS) the vertical drop of the course must be between 120 and 200 meters with a minimum of 18 gates. It is recommended to set around 25 gates in PGS with a horizontal distance (turning pole to turning pole) of between 20-25 meters. The course should have a length on the ground of minimum 400 meters to maximum of 700 meters – recommended is around 550 meters. In general the course should have the same variety of terrain like a GS and with enough width of minimum 40 meters. Slope needs to be wide enough to permit two courses. The terrain must be the same across the surface of the slope. The course layouts must have the same profile and same difficulties.</p> <p>SBX – course must be a minimum of 100m and a maximum of 240m. Recommended length on the ground in the course is around 500-900m (measured by a measuring tape, wheel or GPS). Running time of 40-70 seconds. Width is minimum 40m wide. Course Preparation: track should be closed to the public at least 20 hours before the training. Finish area must be flat and big enough to allow the rider to come to a safe stop. It has to be fenced off completely.</p> <p>Slopestyle – use a terrain park; minimum of two lines with four feature rows. No specific specs are required.
