### 4.1 Competitors:

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Athletes participating in Cross Country Skiing must meet all eligibility requirements outlined below to be eligible to participate in the Ontario Paralympic
Winter Championships:
i. The athlete must be a member in good standing of Cross Country Ontario and hold a Cross Country Canada Racing License.
ii. The athlete must have competed in a qualifying event at either a sanctioned Paralympics Ontario competition or event (e.g. Talent identification camp), or a PSO competition or event such as the Ontario Cup 1 or 2 . Out of province athletes must have competed in a provincial sanctioned event in the athletes province, prior to competing at the Winter Championship.

Coaches
Any staff listed as coaches on the official registration form must be fully certified
(theory, technical and practical) under the National Coaching Certification Program to at least Level 1 in Cross Country Skiing or Community Coach under NCCP. Special provisions will be made for those coaches educated under the CBET program, whose equivalent level of training/education may not have been firmly established by the time of the event.

## 5 FACILITIES

A typical Cross Country Center is required that have accessible facilities and can provide a 5 km course as well as a sprint course.
